Oklahoma

- Senate Bill 687 passed in 2021
 - Includes Telecommunicator CPR as part of training
 - Adds additional duties to the 911 Authority
 - Create a list of authorized expenditures for 911 fees
 - Create a NexGen 911 strategic plan
 - Modified the requirements of local 911 centers to meet the NG911 Strategic plan

Oklahoma

- ~~129~~ 126 - 9-1-1 Answering Points
- 3,433,962 - 911 calls in 2020 (up 10% from 2018)
- 1332 911 operators positions (5 less than 2018)
 - 1170 were filled
 - 14.7% vacancy

Oklahoma

- \$14,756,211 in Landline fees
- \$46,634,902 in Wireless fees (wireless/VoIP)
- Total of **\$61,391,113**
- Overall cost for 911 including operations is **\$129,159,643**

What are a few of the goals of NG9-1-1?

- Enable E911 calls from any networked device
- Enable Geo-independent call access, transfer and backup between PSAP's / ECC's
- Enable a flexible, open, non-proprietary, interoperable internetwork
- Foster increased coordination and partnerships within public safety
- Maximize emergency services capital, operating and maintenance costs



Oklahoma

- NG911 Study conducted in 2020
 - NG911 cost will be 10-12 million annually
 - Cost estimates compared to other States is 13.5 million annually
 - Current Core system and connectivity is 2.5 million
 - 7.5 to 11 million dollar deficit.
 - Majority of the cost is with the Network
 - Redundancy and backup plan very important

Oklahoma

- Rural Oklahoma is a concern on how to fund NG911.
 - 4 Counties without E911 today (5 in 2018)
 - 3 of the 4 have issued plans to deploy
 - Can Small Telco's adapt and send Landline calls to a IP network and not the selectable routers?

Oklahoma

- How will Federal and State Broadband funding and expansion help 911?
- How do we fund 911 and make it equitable when we know rural will cost more for the network?
- Expanding definition of what is included in NG911
- OKC metro minus OKC is going live with NG911

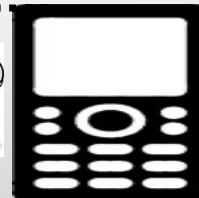
